BAPTISMAL DEATH AND RESURRECTION

As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, we also honor our own baptism as our initiation into the Christian life and community. In the Gospel, the baptism of Jesus, with his immersion and then emergence from the water, points to his later submission to God at his death, and his emergence from the grave at his resurrection. This pattern of death and resurrection is our path too, as followers of Jesus. Throughout life, often in small ways, we learn to surrender our limited and self-centered agendas. This surrender often feels like death. The sacrament of Baptism ritually enacts this pattern to remind us of Jesus' death and resurrection, so that we too might embrace the deaths and resurrections of our own lives. As Jesus emerged from the water, he encountered his Father and the Holy Spirit. Like Jesus, we can know we are God's beloved, empowered by the Spirit.

MUERTE Y RESURRECCIÓN BAPTISMAL

A medida que celebramos el Bautismo del Señor, también honramos nuestro propio bautismo como nuestra iniciación en la vida y comunidad cristiana. En el Evangelio, el bautismo de Jesús, con su inmersión y posterior salida del agua, indica su posterior entrega a Dios en su muerte, y su salida del sepulcro en su resurrección. Como seguidores de Jesús, esta forma de muerte y resurrección también es nuestro camino. A lo largo de la vida, y a menudo de manera limitada, aprendemos a renunciar a nuestros planes egoístas y limitados. Esta renuncia a menudo se siente como la muerte. El Sacramento del Bautismo ritualmente representa este camino para recordarnos la muerte y resurrección de Jesús, para que nosotros también podamos aceptar las muertes y resurrecciones de nuestras propias vidas. Cuando Jesús salió del agua, se encontró con su Padre y el Espíritu Santo. Como Jesús, podemos saber que somos los amados de Dios, fortalecidos por el Espíritu.

The Catholic Catechism states that "Jesus' immersion in the water is a sign for all human beings of the need to die to themselves to do God's will. as baptized Catholics there is only one gift that we need to give to Jesus – the gift of ourselves. As Archbishop Wenski describes it, it is the "Theology of the Gift" when we surrender ourself to God, place our trust in Him and allow the Holy Spirit to work through us for the greater glory of God.

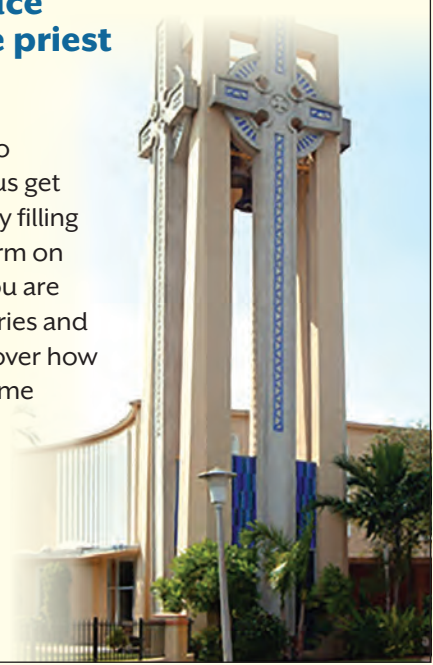

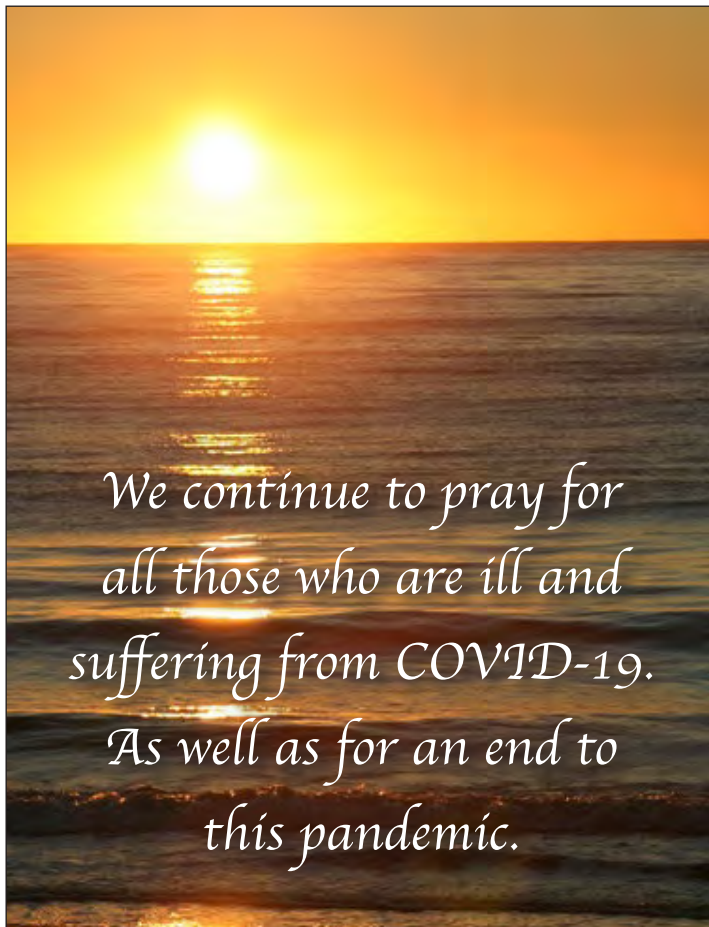

Raising Kind Children

Kind people are those who exhibit empathy, sharing, and compassion. How do you raise kind children in a not-so-kind world? Kindness is a teachable virtue, but you have to make it a high priority. Ask your child this riddle: What gift do you give away that is almost always returned? The answer is KINDNESS.

Acting with kindness toward ourselves and others is a great way to feel good while making a positive difference in the world around us. Encourage your child to perform a daily act of kindness at home or at school. Some ideas include: joining a person who is eating lunch alone, writing a note of appreciation to someone, and passing on a compliment.

One of a toddler's first words is MINE! At that time, a child's world revolves around him. Little by little children need to be taught to share and give of themselves to others. There are many different ways that people can share with one another. Ask your child for examples of what and how people can share. Somehow, the act of sharing seems to add to our feelings of satisfaction and contribute to our selflessness. One of the challenges in life is learning to communicate with and understand others—the ability to show empathy. This is the ability to see and feel the world from another's point of view. A person with empathy acts as if he or she has "walked in our shoes." Use real-life situations to teach your child about empathy. Ask your child, "How do you think that person feels?" "How would you feel if you were in that situation?" This helps the child view life from a different perspective—not always his own.

Compassion is feeling sympathy for another person. A person who is compassionate understands the need or hurt that others may feel. Through this understanding, a compassionate person might feel sympathy for another person. Compassion does not stop here, however. A compassionate person does something to act on those feelings. He helps in some way. As you use real-life situations to teach your child empathy, go one step further and ask, "What could you do to help that person feel better?"

As always, a parent's example is the best teacher. How do you show empathy, compassion and sharing to those around you? Are you a kind adult? Remember, your children are always watching and will imitate your actions!



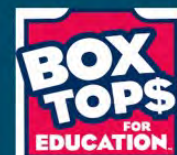
