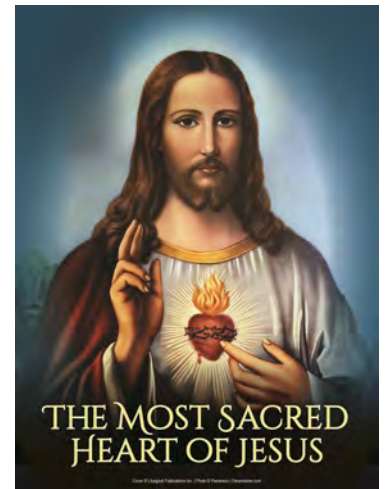

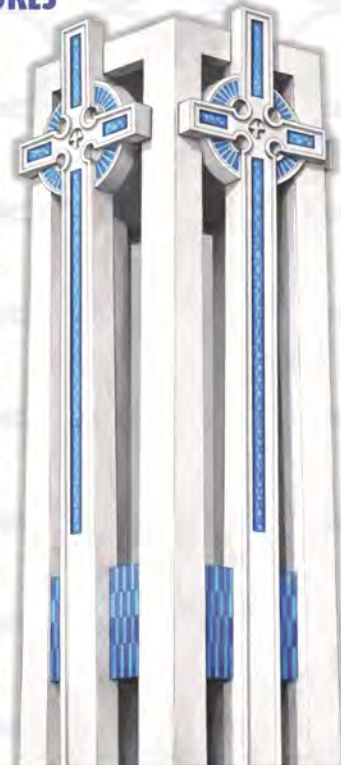

Consecration of the United States to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

On June 11, during their Spring meeting in Orlando, Bishops of the United States will gather at the Basilica Shrine of Mary, Queen of the Universe, to consecrate the United States to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. The consecration will celebrate America's semi quincentennial, that is, the two hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence.

In linking the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence with the devotion to the Sacred Heart, the Bishops invite us to reflect with gratitude on the blessings God has bestowed on our nation but, at the same time, devotion to the Sacred Heart demands that we consider how we might foster truth, justice, and charity in American life. Thus, our celebrations around the Fourth of July will foster a constructive and forward-looking patriotism as opposed to a divisive, exclusionary, blind nationalism.

In his book, *Memory and Identity*, St. John Paul II wrote of the difference between a constructive patriotism and a destructive nationalism: Patriotism is love for everything to do with our native land: its history, its traditions, its language, its natural features. It is a love which extends also to the works of our compatriots and the fruits of their genius. Whereas nationalism involves recognizing and pursuing the good of one's own nation alone, without regard for the rights of others, patriotism is a love for one's native land that accords rights to all other nations equal to those claimed for one's own. Patriotism, in other words, leads to a properly ordered social love. We are called to bring our faith into the actions we take and the lives we lead in our communities. We celebrate the ways the Church has contributed to a more just world, and we invite all in our society to see the face of Christ reflected in each sister and brother.

In *Dilexi Te*, Pope Leo XIV invited us to contemplate Christ's love, which moves us out on our mission to attend to our sisters and brothers suffering in the world today, particularly in our care for poor and vulnerable people. As we meditate on Christ's self-offering for the sake of all, we are naturally led to ask why we too should not be ready to give our lives for others. On the eve of our nation's 250 birthday, we recognize that our American experiment in democracy is still a work in progress. As American Catholics we recognize how far short our nation falls in many areas in forming a more perfect union. But while we recognize flaws and work to correct them, we also acknowledge the blessings of liberty we enjoy in this great country. In spite of extreme polarization, bitter partisanship, and entrenched divisions, we Catholics do not despair of America.

We love America – but let's love her as Jesus loves, not just with a sentimental, saccharine love but with love in truth – a love that is stronger than sin. A love that names the sin not to damn the sinner but to call the sinner to conversion of heart and mind. For the love that opened its arms on a cross of wood and opened its side to a soldier's lance piercing his heart is love that believes that the sinner can be redeemed. While predating our nation's independence, devotion to the Sacred Heart has developed over the centuries following the experiences of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1643-1690) and the apparitions she witnessed in the seventeenth century. Since then, popes have lauded the practice of consecration of the self, home, and even whole nations to the Sacred Heart.

In his encyclical instituting the Solemnity of Christ the King, Pope Pius XI, drawing on the teaching of Pope Leo XIII, commended the "pious custom" of consecrating the nation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus as a way to recognize the kingship of Christ. Devotion to the Sacred Heart, like the more recent devotion to the Divine Mercy, echoes the invitation that Jesus makes in the gospels to those who are "weary and heavily burdened" because of sin and hurt to turn to him for mercy, healing and restoration.

Indeed, devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and devotion to the Divine Mercy have one and the same message: namely, that humanity is good and is greatly loved by God, and God generously offers mercy to all. St. John Paul II once said: "It is this love which must inspire humanity today, if it is to face the crisis of the meaning of life, the challenges of the most diverse needs and, especially, the duty to defend the dignity of every human person.

Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us!

En vísperas del 250.º aniversario de nuestra nación

El 11 de junio, durante su reunión de primavera en Orlando, los obispos de los Estados Unidos se congregarán en la Basílica Santuario de María, Reina del Universo, para consagrar a los Estados Unidos al Sacratísimo Corazón de Jesús. Esta consagración celebrará el 250º aniversario de los Estados Unidos; es decir, el ducentésimo quincuagésimo aniversario de la firma de la Declaración de Independencia.

Al vincular el 250º aniversario de la Declaración de Independencia con la devoción al Sagrado Corazón, los obispos nos invitan a reflexionar con gratitud sobre las bendiciones que Dios ha derramado sobre nuestra nación; sin embargo, al mismo tiempo, la devoción al Sagrado Corazón exige que consideremos de qué manera podemos fomentar la verdad, la justicia y la caridad en la vida estadounidense. De este modo, nuestras celebraciones en torno al 4 de julio promoverán un patriotismo constructivo y con visión de futuro, en contraposición a un nacionalismo divisivo, excluyente y ciego.

En su libro *Memoria e identidad*, San Juan Pablo II escribió sobre la diferencia entre un patriotismo constructivo y un nacionalismo destructivo: «El patriotismo es el amor por todo aquello que concierne a la propia patria: su historia, sus tradiciones, su lengua, sus características naturales. Es un amor que se extiende también a las obras de los compatriotas y a los frutos de su genio. Mientras que el nacionalismo implica reconocer y buscar el bien de la propia nación exclusivamente, sin tener en cuenta los derechos de los demás, el patriotismo es un amor por la propia patria que reconoce a todas las demás naciones derechos iguales a los que reclama para la propia». El patriotismo, en otras palabras, conduce a un amor social debidamente ordenado.

Estamos llamados a integrar nuestra fe en las acciones que emprendemos y en las vidas que llevamos dentro de nuestras comunidades. Celebramos las diversas formas en que la Iglesia ha contribuido a la construcción de un mundo más justo, e invitamos a todos los miembros de nuestra sociedad a reconocer el rostro de Cristo reflejado en cada hermana y cada hermano. En su encíclica *Dilexi Te*, el Papa León XIII nos invitó a contemplar el amor de Cristo, el cual nos impulsa a salir al encuentro —como parte de nuestra misión— de las hermanas y los hermanos que hoy sufren en el mundo, particularmente a través de nuestro cuidado de las personas pobres y vulnerables. Al meditar sobre la autodonación de Cristo en favor de todos, nos sentimos naturalmente impulsados a preguntarnos por qué nosotros no habríamos de estar también dispuestos a entregar nuestras vidas por los demás. En vísperas del 250.º aniversario de nuestra nación, reconocemos que nuestro experimento estadounidense de democracia sigue siendo una obra en curso. Como católicos estadounidenses, reconocemos cuánto dista nuestra nación —en muchos aspectos— de conformar una unión más perfecta. Pero, si bien reconocemos sus fallas y trabajamos para corregirlas, también valoramos las bendiciones de libertad que disfrutamos en este gran país. A pesar de la polarización extrema, el partidismo acérrimo y las divisiones arraigadas, nosotros, los católicos, no perdemos la esperanza en Estados Unidos.

Amamos a Estados Unidos; pero amémoslo como ama Jesús: no solo con un amor sentimental y dulzón, sino con un amor en la verdad; un amor que es más fuerte que el pecado. Un amor que señala el pecado, no para condenar al pecador, sino para invitarlo a la conversión del corazón y de la mente. Pues el amor que abrió sus brazos en una cruz de madera —y abrió su costado ante la lanza de un soldado que traspasó su corazón— es un amor que cree en la redención del pecador.

Aunque es anterior a la independencia de nuestra nación, la devoción al Sagrado Corazón se ha desarrollado a lo largo de los siglos, a partir de las experiencias de Santa Margarita María de Alacoque (1643-1690) y de las apariciones de las que ella fue testigo en el siglo XVII. Desde entonces, los papas han elogiado la práctica de consagrarse a sí mismos —así como el hogar e incluso naciones enteras— al Sagrado Corazón. En su encíclica por la que instituyó la Solemnidad de Cristo Rey, el Papa Pío XI —basándose en las enseñanzas del Papa León XIII— recomendó la «piadosa costumbre» de consagrar la nación al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús como un modo de reconocer la realeza de Cristo.

La devoción al Sagrado Corazón —al igual que la más reciente devoción a la Divina Misericordia— se hace eco de la invitación que Jesús formula en los Evangelios a aquellos que se sienten «cansados y agobiados» por el pecado y el dolor: la invitación a acudir a Él en busca de misericordia, sanación y restauración. En efecto, la devoción al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús y la devoción a la Divina Misericordia comparten un mismo mensaje: que la humanidad es buena, que es inmensamente amada por Dios y que Dios ofrece su misericordia generosamente a todos.

San Juan Pablo II dijo una vez: «Es este amor el que debe inspirar hoy a la humanidad, si quiere afrontar la crisis del sentido de la vida, los desafíos de las más diversas necesidades y, especialmente, el deber de defender la dignidad de toda persona humana».

¡Sacratísimo Corazón de Jesús, ten misericordia de nosotros!

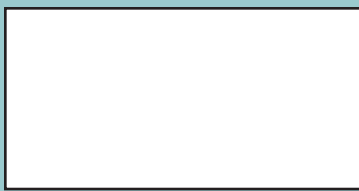
